DETAC Announces New Results in Systems Excellence (RISE) Peer e-Learning Community: Assistive Technology & Employment

As AoD grantees (directly or indirectly) support individuals with disabilities to obtain and retain competitive, integrated employment (CIE), they are faced with unprecedented challenges in supporting people with disabilities to access the vital assistive technology that is needed for daily living or CIE. Some individuals who desperately need the supports in the form of assistive technology cannot obtain what is needed due to funding limitations, lack of resources or their provider's inability to fund such supports. Grantees are presented with the dilemma in the lack of resources, funding, and partnerships that support individuals with disabilities to utilize the emergent technology needed to excel in activities of everyday life.

If your grantee organization is experiencing some challenges with the lack of resources, knowledge, or partnerships to support the advancement of assistive technology for people with disabilities in your state, then this RISE Peer e-Learning Community in Assistive Technology and Employment is for you!

The spirit of the ADA and the Assistive Technology Act is equity, fair and impartial access for people with disabilities. Assistive Technology (AT) can impact a person's well-being by improving their ability to connect with others, access their community, work, and live more independently. AT includes any piece of equipment, or product, whether acquired commercially, modified, or customized, that is used to increase, maintain, or improve functional capabilities of individuals with disabilities.

Join us as we review both traditional and new tools / resources, gain a broader perspective, brainstorm strategies to leverage collaborative partners, integrate smart screen technology on a larger scale, and plan for successful implementation of AT structures within your organization to advance competitive, integrated employment for people with disabilities.

Join the next DETAC webinar focused on the use and benefits of value, performance, and outcome-based payment methodologies to help further advance competitive integrated employment (CIE) within managed long-term services and supports (MLTSS) programs. In this webinar, you will learn about effective practices being implemented from both emerging and long-standing state MLTSS programs. From these examples, you will see how the proactive partnerships formed helped create effective payment methodologies to advance CIE opportunities and outcomes for people with disabilities receiving MLTSS. AoD grantees play a key role for the creation of sustainable partnerships to design and implement value, performance, and outcome-based payment methodologies to advance CIE for individuals with disabilities. Webinar presenters will include a representative from Inclusa Inc., Moving to a Different Drum LLC, and Michigan Developmental Disabilities Council. Participants learned how a Center for Independent Living, Able-South Carolina has worked with stakeholders to advance legislation supporting the phase-out of 14(c) sheltered work options for individuals with disabilities. Additionally, participants heard from a self-advocate that was formerly in a sheltered workshop for over ten years and how competitive, integrated employment has provided meaning and purpose to her life. The California State Council on Developmental Disabilities also shared their experience with proposing and passing legislation to fully abolish the use of 14(c) sheltered work in California, in addition to sharing how they worked with another AoD grantee, Disability Rights California to advance the legislative efforts to end sheltered work and increase competitive, integrated employment.

On the heels of last month's content-rich webinar on how AoD grantees can promote the Financial Wellness of individuals with disabilities, we heard from many of you asking for us to take a deeper dive into tackling the complexities around work

incentives and benefits planning. So, ask and you shall receive! Participants heard how AoD grantees are building their internal competencies and partnering with other entities to assure that jobseekers and workers with disabilities are accessing accurate information and taking full advantage of work incentives available to them via Social Security. Participants heard from grantees who have become Employment Networks (ENs) to support individuals through the Ticket to Work program, grantees who are offering various levels of benefits planning as a service to individuals with disabilities, and others who are pushing for improved systems, policies, and funding to assure greater access of people with disabilities to high-quality benefits planning.

This webinar showcased promising practices in supporting individuals with disabilities conduct strong benefits planning, take advantage of financial literacy tools and resources, build assets, and achieve optimal economic advancement, thus making the dream of CIE become a reality.

Close to 500 participants joined the DETAC as we celebrated the importance of including individuals with disabilities in the Nation's workforce. This webinar highlighted the contributions of individuals with disabilities through demonstrating how Centers for Independent Living have supported individuals with disabilities to

obtain and maintain competitive, integrated employment through the application of evidence-based practices and other innovative strategies.

Coming Soon: DETAC Learning Management System

The AoD Disability TA Center's Learning Management System (LMS) is in the final phases of being completed! The interactive platform will serve as a hub where AoD grantees can complete courses on a variety of topics, receive professional development, participate in peer-learning communities, topical discussions, and download AoD-grantee-specific curriculum and trainings. There will be five courses completed on a rolling basis in 2022 focusing on the following topics: Building a First Class CIL Employment Program, Assistive Technology and Employment, Councils and Employment, Financial Capability, and Employer Engagement. Once courses are developed, we will begin sending grantees links and options to create accounts.

The Disability Employment TA Center invites you to participate in our National Community of Practice, which will provide access to educational webinars, virtual communications, specific TA events and activities, and informational resources that will be useful across various stakeholders. The goal of hosting a national Community of Practice is to create collaborative learning opportunities for all AoD grantees and other stakeholders who work with AoD grantees to improve competitive, integrated employment outcomes and economic advancement of individuals with disabilities.
